October 2, 2009 - **Double Concerto for Two Violins and String Orchestra** - Long Island Mozart Festival Chamber Orchestra, with violinists Anna Rabinova and Dmitri Berlinsky. Conducted by Daniel Boico, recently named assistant conductor of the New York Philharmonic. Performances at Old Westbury Gardens in Old Westbury, New York.

Recent premieres have included:

May 31, 2009 - **Piano Trio No. 2** at the Kosciuszko Foundation in New York with performers from Chamber Players International, Anna Rabinova violin, Qiang Tu cello and Tatiana Goncharova pianist.

January 24, 2009 - **Florentine Visions** for piano, premiered and commissioned by Italian pianist Chiara Bertoglio.

September 1, 2008 - **Concerto Green**, (Double Concerto for piano and violin soli with String Orchestra), premiered at the Long Island Mozart Festival, conducted by Daniel Boico - recently recorded (February 2009) with Dmitri Berlinsky, violin, Tatiana Goncharova pianist and Daniel Boico conducting.

...AND DON'T FORGET DAVID WINKLER'S CD FROM NAXOS

A wonderful CD of David Winkler's orchestral works has been issued by Naxos.



American Classics Catalogue No: 8.559383, was recorded by an international all-star array of talent, and features two major works:

1 - The composer's **Piano Concerto**, written in 2006 and performed by pianist Alexander Panizza and the Orquesta Sinfonica de la Universidad de Cuyo, based in Mendoza, Argentina and conducted by David Handel.

2 – **Elements Concerti**, from 2005, performed by the New York Philharmonic's Anna Rabinova, with the Orchestre de Chambre Français, conducted by Ivan Meylemans of the Netherlands.

This disk has received critical acclaim. **American Record Guide** has written, "David Winkler,, is an American composer whose heart is utterly romantic, at least in the two concertos here. Both are quite energetic, with the violin concerto (Elements Concertos of 2005) being the standout... Sound and performances are excellent... I hope Naxos releases this man's

symphonies...his creative vision is very original."
