It all began with Barbara Oldham's letter to Dr. Erik Sanderson, author of Mannahatta: A Natural History of New York City and leader of the Wildlife Conservation Society's Mannahatta Project. She wrote, "Last May I read the New Yorker article about your work on reconstructing the ecology of Manhattan from 1609. Loving nature and history, I was immediately enchanted with the idea of the Mannahatta project. I was amazed at your development of the Muir web."

"Inspired by your work, we have commissioned several new works to connect to the idea of nature and change in the Hudson Valley and we plan to perform a number of concerts and neighborhood and educational outreach programs."

Now, Quintet of the Americas is proud to announce the first scheduled concerts of the project, presenting environmentally-themed music throughout the five boroughs of New York City. All of these events are free and open to the public.

Thursday, April 22 (Earth Day) – 7 PM - <u>Bayside</u> <u>Historical Society</u>, 208 Totten Avenue, Fort Totten in Bayside, Queens.

Repertoire for this concert includes two World Premieres – **Mannahatta Windows** by Robert Deemer and **Hudson River Quintet** by Christopher Kaufman for woodwind quintet with surround-sound audio tape and video of the Hudson River and environmental paintings. **Ellis Island** by Stuart Balcomb and **Quiet Tide** by Mark Dancigers will also be presented.

The event also includes a panel, led by Dr. Sanderson, with environmental artist Ken Cro-Ken, composer Christopher Kaufman and the performing musicians.



Quintet of the Americas was in concert with Cuarteto Latinoamericano string quartet on Wednesday, March 10 at Manhattan's Americas Society. This standing room only concert celebrated the Bicentennial of Mexican Independence.



A special work was commissioned for event from Mexican composer Mario Lavista Gargantúa is nonet for the combined forces of winds the strings of the two

ensembles. Also on the program, Quintet of the Americas performed **Danza del mediodia** by Arturo Marquez, **Juegos nocturnos** by Federico

Ibarra and another work by Lavista, Marsias for solo oboe and 8 tuned water glasses which featured Quintet oboist Matt Sullivan accompanied by the other Quintet members playing the tuned water glasses. The Cuarteto also performed Metro Chabacano by Javier Alvarez and La Calaca (last dance from Altar de Muertos) by Gabriela Ortiz.
